New Lochac Marshal's Handbook

Greetings all,

The KEM has offered me the honour of announcing that the new Lochac Marshals' Handbook was proclaimed at Midwinter Coronation as being 'live'.

Many of you will have read this during the drafting and editing phases of the work, and I would like to thank you all for the feedback that was submitted. It is my sincere hope that this handbook meets both the needs and the desires of the Kingdom.

There are a number of changes that this handbook brings about, but possibly the most important two are the following. At this time they only apply to Armoured Combat, but I believe that in time the structure will be extended to the Rapier field as well.

1 - All authorised combatants over the age of 18 may now act as Auxiliary Marshals. An Auxiliary Marshal may not inspect equipment, or perform authorisations, but they CAN act as a marshal for the purposes of overseeing combat.

There must still be a person who is an authorised Marshal to act as Marshal in Charge for the field, but on the tournament field the Marshal in Charge may take the field as a combatant, and allow the Auxiliary Marshals to oversee the combat.

On any combat field involving more than two people fighting (melees, wars etc), the Marshal in Charge may not be one of the combatants.

2 - Only Senior Marshals may perform authorisations.

A Senior Marshal may authorise a fighter, or Marshal. Two Senior Marshals can authorise another Senior Marshal.

This is a change that will have an impact upon many groups and marshals, and so the following process will be used to allow for an easy transition.

- Authorisation forms from non Senior Marshals will be accepted by Lists until September 1st.
- The KEM will work with Group Marshals to select a number of people to be issued with Senior Marshal authorisations (a number of people already hold these)
- Those Senior Marshals may then make more Senior Marshals as required.

If you have any concerns about not having enough Senior Marshals to perform authorisations, please talk to your Group Marshal and to the KEM, who will no doubt do their best to assist.

Please take some time to read the Marshals' Handbook. It is not perfect, and changes will no doubt be made in future. If you find a problem, please tell the Earl Marshal@lochac. sca.org).

There is also a Fighters' Handbook in a similar format to the Marshals' Handbook, and you may find links to it. This Fighters' Handbook is NOT yet 'live', and will continue to be worked on.

I would like to thank all those who contributed to the handbook over the years for their monumental efforts.

Mini Moot Recipe Series - Part 2

Anyone who was at Mini Moot this year, will agree how wonderful Saturday night's feast was. Lady Isobel Rosewell provided a truly delightful culinary experience.

Well, now she has provided the actual recipes that were used, for all to enjoy. In this special series all the recipes will be printed. This is part 1 of the Mini Moot Recipe series.

The original recipes were from "The Good Huswifes Handmaide for the Kitchen: A Period Recipe Book" published around 1590, and again in 1992 by Stuart Press."

The redactions are by the good Lady Isobel, herself. We hope you enjoy them.

Balls of Mutton

Recipe

take your mutton and mince it very fine with suet. Then season it with sugar, cinnamon, ginger, cloves and mace, salt and raw eggs. Make it in round balls. Let your broth seethe ere you put them in. Make your broth with currants, dates, whole mace and salt. thick it with yolks of eggs and vergious and serve it upon sopps

Redaction

Mix Minced meat with Suet. Mix in cinnamon, sugar ginger and cloves. And 1 egg per 500g of mince. Make into tomball (large marble or small golf ball) sized balls. Make broth by seething dried fruits, mace and salt. Cook meatballs in seething broth.

Tarte of Bread

Redaction

50g / 2 oz soft butter 10 slices soft white bread, ¼ tsp freshly grated nutmeg ¼ tsp cinnamon 350 ml / 12 fl oz milk 50 ml / 2 fl oz double / heavy cream 2 large free range eggs 25g / 1 oz white sugar 1 tsp vanilla extract or paste. Heat the oven 355° F/180°C/Gas 4. Grease a 2 pint/1 litre pie dish with a little of the butter, toss the bread cubes through melted butter, and place into the trays. lightly sprinkle with nutmeg and cinnamon. In a saucepan gently heat the milk and cream - DO NOT BOIL. In a large baking bowl beat the eggs with 3/4 sugar and the vanilla extract until light and airy and pale in color. Pour the warm milk over the eggs and continue beating until all the milk is added. Pour the egg mixture slowly and evenly over the bread until all the liquid is added. Gently press the surface with your hand to push the bread into the liquid. Sprinkle the remaining sugar over the surface then leave to one side for 30 mins. Bake the pudding in the hot oven for 40 - 45 mins, until the surface is golden brown and the pudding well risen and the egg is set. Serve hot. We're making 8 square foil tins of mix.

Stued Pottage in Lent

Recipe

take a faire pot, and fill it full of water, and take a saucer full of oyle olive, and put it into the pot. Then set your pot on the fire and let it boil. Then take parslie roots and fennell roots and scrape them cleane then cut them the bigness of a prune and put them into the pot. then take bread and cut it in sops and cast it into a pot of wine then straine it and put it in the pot. then take rosemarie time and parsley and bind them together and put them into the pot. then take dates, prunes currants and great raisons and wash them cleane and put them in the pot then season your pot with salt, cloves, mace and a littel sugar. if it be not red ynough, take saunders and colour your pot therewith. looke that your both be thick enough.

Redaction

Fill a 10L pot with water, and add 1/2 cup olive oil. Put on to boil. peel and roughly chop parsnips. Finely slice fennell. Roughly chop 4 loaves of bread soak in red wine. Tie rosemary, parsley and bay leaves into a bunch. Put vegetables and drained bread into the soup. simmer. Add 4 cups dried fruit. season with mace, salt, cloves and sugar. We're making 8L of thick stew.
