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November Crown Report

There are moments in the SCA that people sometimes refer to as "The Dream". For me these tend to come at odd times, and are not always surrounded by strictly period activities. For me one of these moments happened after a nine hour drive to November Crown (including a detour, because as it turns out I was supposed to go past the "Road Closed" sign) as I was taking my things into the bunkhouse. There was not a lot of room in the bunkhouse, so people had elected to leave their armour out the front. There, amongst the bags of equipment, were shields displaying the devices of many of the people who would be fighting the next day. This casual heraldic display got me suddenly caught up with the excitement of what promised to be a great tournament.

After a pleasant evening of dancing and chatting to some of Duke Cornelius' newly trained fighters (seriously there is some good talent his school is starting to turn out) the day of the tourney dawned. This was a good field as not only were there a large number of nights, but there were a handful of unbelted fighters capable of going all the way too. Crown was run as an Atlantean speed Tourney, leading to four semi-finalists. The unbeaten Sir Felix fought Iarla Bran, while the unbeaten Honourable Lord Andrew Daniels of Brockwood (fighting Florentine) met Sir Thorolf. Despite losing one bout to Sir Thorolf, Andrew Daniels met Felix in the final. The final was fought as a best of three, but after Felix won the first bout emphatically I thought it would be all over in two bouts. Andrew Daniels was fighting superbly but Felix simply looked unstoppable. I was proved wrong however when Andrew Daniels refused to allow Felix to take control and won the second bout. Nevertheless Sir Felix prevailed in the third and final bout thus winning the tourney.

During court that afternoon Felix and Eva were made the first Crown Princess of Lochac from Innilgard. In the same court Mistress Filippa Ginevra Francesca di Lucignano was admitted into the order of the Laurel. The rest of the event was an enjoyable mix of feasting (the food all weekend was very good), socialising and fighting a rose tourney on the Sunday. I fully commend the people of Adora for their welcoming and friendly nature, while organising a large event without a hiccup.


