The Kingdom of Lochac banner went up behind the stage, proudly displaying where we are from. Later in the evening when the lights were low, and the tables candlelit, the banner glowed from behind shining out over the populace.

Then the Lords and Ladies of the realm started to appear, dressed in their finest as befits a coronation of the King and Queen. Merchants set up their tables selling fine table crafts, books and miscellaneous wares.

And while all this was occurring in sight of all, in the background preparations continued onwards in the kitchens, creating sustenance for all. A lunch of pasties, and platters of fruit all came our way. All the while roasting and baking continued for the feast later in the evening. I happened to glance in upon occasion, and to my pleasure the kitchen and volunteers were running with quick and smooth efficiency, all knowing their craft well, as well as knowing each other.

Tables were rolled in, the hall prepared for the nights feast. Candles were lit, and the High table prepared. Our first course appeared on the tables, and the buzz of conversation and the atmosphere in the hall took you back to times past.
