# Recipes



## Mini Moot Recipe Series – Part 1

Anyone who was at Mini Moot this year, will agree how wonderful Saturday night's feast was. Lady Isobel Rosewell provided a truly delightful culinary experience.

Well, now she has provided the actual recipes that were used, for all to enjoy. In this special series all the recipes will be printed. This is part 1 of the Mini Moot Recipe series.

The original recipes were from "The Good Huswives Handmaide for the Kitchen: A Period Recipe Book" published around 1590, and again in 1992 by Stuart Press."

The redactions are by the good Lady Isobel, herself. We hope you enjoy them.

### A Tarte of Cheese

#### Recipe

Make your tart, and then take Banberie Cheese, and pare away the outside of it, and cut the cleane cheese in small peeces and put them into the Tart, and when your tart is full of cheese, then put two handfuls of sugar into your tart upon your cheese and cast in it five or sixe spoonfuls of Roosewater, and close it up with a cover, and with a feather lay sweet molten butter upon it, and fine sugar, and bake it in a soft oven.

#### Redaction

Blindbake Shortcrust pastry in square foil trays. Chop 3kg of Colby Cheese into 1cm cubes. Crumble the crumbly cheese. Mix colby, crumbly cheese and ricotta, 1cup castor sugar and plenty of rosewater together, and "spread" into the baked shortcrust. top the tarts with flaky pastry and brush with butter. Bake in a moderate (180) oven until golden brown. We're making 5 of these tarts.

### Boyled Mutton with Roots

#### Recipe

take mutton and cut it the bignes of your thombe, and put it inot a pot with faire water and make it seeth. Then take carret rootes, parsnip, marrow, turneps or other roots as you will scrape them cleane and cut them of the biggness of your muttton and let them seethe. then put in half a handful of stripped tume, as much of savorie and isope or other herbs and a little salt and pepper. and so let them stew till they be verie tender.

#### Redaction

Dice Onions Carrots, Parsnips, turnips and other root vegetables to 1cm cubes (or similar rough). Put the cubed meat and vegetables into a large pot of water. Bring to the boil. Add Thyme, Bay Leaves, Parsley, and sliced spinach stems, salt and pepper to taste. Simmer until very tender. We're making 10 litres of soup

### Custard in Lent

#### Recipe

take half a pound of almonds, blanch them and beat them in a mortar. Then take a quart of fair water, warm it luke warm and strayne your liquour with the almonds then ..... Take two spoonfuls of the flower of rice and put it into your almonds then take sugar cloves maces saffron and salt and season your liquor therewith eve as ye would season a custard of cream. put small raisons and dates in the bottom of your custard as you do unto a custard of cream.

#### Redaction

Take the packet of Almond Meal and mix with 5l of warm water. Take , 5tbsp of sugar, 5tsp clove powder, 1packet saffron and some salt to taste. Stir these together well, and when you are ready to cook, strain and press the mixture through a muslin cloth. warm the mixture in a saucepan, stirring constantly. Add Rice Flour (~10tbsp) to thicken.

### Use of Steel Blades for Minors

The Victorian Licensing & Regulation Division has just confirmed that minors are allowed to use steel blades in Victoria provided the minor holds a valid SCA membership (not day memberships). The SCA's exemption allows the possession or use of a sword for the purposes of studying and participating in the re-enactment of historical events. The exemption does not remove the restrictions placed on a child to sell or purchase a prohibited weapon.
